
Pot Songs by Herb Superb

Cop falls victim to prohibition

Senior Constable Lee Lorenc was recently charged with theft, possession of cannabis and perverting the course of justice after a colleague saw him take a seized bag of cannabis into change rooms at the Lilydale Police Station in Victoria where a smaller bag of the cannabis was found in his locker.

Senior Constable Richard Blackwood stated Lorenc had been seen entering the change rooms with the cannabis and when he saw the cannabis again later in the day, it was "blatantly obvious" that there was about half as much cannabis in the bag. The committal hearing will continue.
