If Telemetry Orchestra were a drawing, they'd be a Pop Art illustration tampered within Photoshop, decked with

Photoshop, decked with curious shapes and spaceage colour. On *Children*Stay Free, the band step away from Clan Analogue (who've released their earlier recordings, such as the 1995)

(who've released their earlier recordings, such as the 1998 album Live Better Electrically), to release an album full of marvel and sophistication. Cowboy Sunshine resembles Yo La Tengo soundtracking life in orbit and on a Western.

Yo La Tengo soundtracking life in orbit and on a Western ranch, Wish fires warm helical rounds of electropop, while Shutterspeed exudes the French cool of Laetitia Sadier and Stereolab's refined future-

and Stereolab's refined futurepop melodies. The band's inclusion of singer/songwriter Charlotte Whittingham has definitely been a plus, evident on the excellent track Under The Knife, which melds icy-

cool rhythms and gorgeously unfazed female vocals with all the dexterity of Broadcast. You could exhaust all the band comparison possibilities

(Mùm, Hope Sandoval, early Sneaker Pimps) but it's undeniable Telemetry Orchestra have thoroughly

minted their own sound.
